

Equity Market Update

Euphoria sparked at D-street driving domestic equity market high as local stocks took cues from global news flows and economic events that indicated an ease in the pace of recession. Recovery in major equity markets worldwide, better than expected economic news, robust FII inflows, the 'green shoots' mania and the resulting ease in risk aversion boosted sentiment for local stocks in delivering a strong performance. Sensex gained 17.46% in April to emerge as the second best performer as compared to other BRIC nations - Brazil (16%), Russia (21%) and China (10.87%). Sensex gained close to 1,700 points to settle at 11,403.25 points while the Nifty gained 15% to close at 3473.95. On the sectoral front, realty gained over 36% and banks, over 26% cheered by rate cuts while FMCG was up near 3%.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) turned net buyers of Indian equities during April, to the tune of Rs 6,682 crore and offset the entire outflow of Rs 6,151 crore in three months to March 2009.

Governments around the world provided fresh stimulus in the form of various monetary and fiscal policy measures that provided required boost to the global economies. Additionally, concerns about external liquidity fell significantly after the G20's commitment of IMF resources to emerging markets. However, the Swine flu outbreak remained a threat for the global economy adversely affecting the travel & tourism industry while markets also showed angst to another delay in the release of stress-test results for 19 of the largest US banks.

On the domestic front, the RBI provided boosts through rate cuts and a constant support was offered by easing WPI inflation rate. Monetary policy actions in the past along with fiscal stimulus also seemed to be taking effect in the economy. Cement dispatches, telecom subscribers, auto and retail sales all indicate that the pace of economic decline is moderating. But on the other hand, sentiment remained jittery as trends in real estate and macro data such as exports, credit off-take and tax collections continued to be disappointing.


Corporate earnings remained a mixed bag. Infosys posted disappointing Q4 numbers but encouraging results from Wipro partially overshadowed the weak sectoral stance. However, the poor guidance outlook remained a cause of concern. Petro-chemical giant Reliance reported a 9.4%y-o-y drop in profits on weaker demand for its petrochemical products, while lower crude-oil prices squeezed its refining margins. HDFC bank reported 34% y-o-y rise in net profits while ICICI Bank reported 35.3% y-o-y fall in net profit.

The acquisition of beleaguered Satyam gave Tech Mahindra a shot of becoming the fourth pillar of the Indian IT story. However, the greatest challenge for Tech Mahindra would be how proficiently it is able to remove Satyam's legacy issues with minimum hiccups.

Outlook:

Markets continued their uptrend in April with liquidity and cheap valuations driving the Sensex and Nifty to new highs. In May, markets are expected to take direction from the Lok Sabha election results. Another global factor which would be keenly watched would be the stress case results of the 19 top US banks. Markets would react negatively to a fractured Lok Sabha election mandate and any huge capital demand from these US banks. Monsoon is expected to be normal this year but any change in estimates close to the end of the month can be a very big negative. Overall, May is expected to be a volatile month with the major drivers being the domestic political scenario and global cues.

Debt Market Update

Liquidity remained the frontrunner in driving government bond yields down as large amount of excess cash in the banking system rekindled investor demand for debt and helped calm fears, ensuring smooth functioning of debt auctions. The ten-year benchmark yield curve shifted to a lower plane with the benchmark yield falling 98 bps to a low of 6.03% from 7.01% in the beginning of the month. Volatility however emerged at lower levels of yields with traders taking profits after sharp rise in prices and the yield climbing to end at 6.24% later in the month. The redemption of two dated securities released Rs.40,000 crore into the system while increased government spending ahead of national elections in April and May also augmented the prevailing surplus cash in the system. Interest payments and slower loan growth in confluence provided a further boost to cash and thus sentiment for bonds. Inter-bank rates remained stuck to the RBI borrowing rate with bids at the LAF reverse repo averaging to more than a trillion rupees throughout the month.

The RBI in its monetary policy review held on April 21, cut the LAF repo and reverse repo rates by 25 bps each to 4.75% and 3.25% respectively thereby contributing to a strong rally in the bond market. The CRR and SLR rates were kept unchanged at 5% and 24% of NDTL (net demand and time liability) respectively. The 10-year benchmark yield fell over 20 bps in an immediate reaction to the rate cuts though a cut of 25-50 bps was already factored in by the market. Other key takeaways of the policy was the challenge of a need to facilitate a return of high growth trajectory and the RBI in response said that it would ensure ample liquidity by continuing to take a more active role in the borrowing program, which would also then enable banks to lower lending rates. This was in line with expectations of the RBI engaging in more OMO's and MSS unwind.

Weekly data released by RBI indicated government's borrowings overshooting the WMA (Ways and Means Advances) limits 2 weeks in a row which is worrisome. The weekly statistical supplement showed government borrowed Rs.40,412 crore of loan from the central bank in the week ending April 24. Uncertainty on how the government would finance the repayment of the outstanding loan in view of the current economic scenario was causing jitters in the market and fuelling speculations of more debt issuances. Meanwhile, WPI rose slightly with inflation at 0.57% y-o-y for the week ended April 18, above the previous month's 0.26%. The credit growth witnessed a sharp deceleration in the previous month despite banking system being awashed with ample liquidity. The money supply rose 20.5% y-o-y in two weeks to April 10, above a 18.3% increase in two weeks earlier after a sluggish increase in March.

Choppiness emerged in the non-SLR market activity with the 5-year AAA bond yield climbing as traders liquidated positions ahead of the upcoming fresh debt issuances, though an initial rally on surplus liquidity saw yields easing to a low of 7.22% from above 8% in early month. Bond spreads rebounded from 120 bps to over 140 bps, reflecting the still lower flow of funds to commercial sector given the slowdown in the economy.

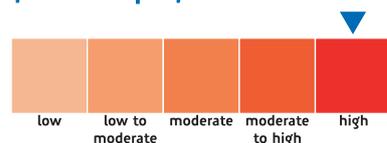
Outlook:

During the month, yields are expected to be volatile on account of abundant liquidity pairing with high government borrowing. We expect the 10yr Benchmark G-sec to remain in the range of 6.50%-5.75%. Increased supply of corporate bonds may put some pressure on corporate bond yields.

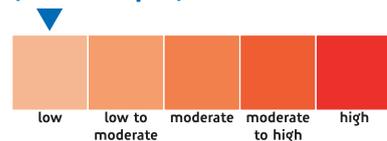
rolling yearly performance





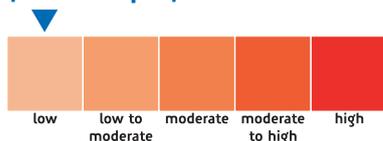
rolling yearly performance





Macro analysis of the economy is carried out by tracking the trends in key economic indicators.

Market dynamics are also studied apart from the above to determine our view of the changes likely in the interest rate scenario and equity market movements. Price movements in the market are monitored at all times along with factors that affect them such as the prevailing market sentiments, cash flows in the market and views/actions of key market participants including institutional investors like FIIs and mutual funds. For analyzing the debt markets, yield curve movements and changes in its shape are also studied.

The **risk appetite and investment objective** is clearly defined for each fund keeping in mind the investment horizon, liquidity requirements etc.

A range of acceptable holdings under each asset class is determined at the investment policy level. The **asset allocation** primarily takes into account, the investment objectives, regulatory issues and the likely risk return matrix to obtain a potential return which is the highest achievable for the risk that is assumed. Within the strategic asset allocation, the fund managers determine the weights of the various asset classes; primarily factoring in the developing market scenarios.

Based on the investment objectives of each fund option, a rigorous **security selection** process is followed. The fixed income fund manager identifies cheaper securities across the yield curve and builds a basket of securities to arrive at the optimum level of yield within the range of pre-determined 'duration' for the entire portfolio after paying particular attention to the liquidity position and the liquidity premium on the securities. An active fund management style is followed on the equity portfolios. A core portfolio of stocks is first created driven by a top-down approach and a research based bottom-up stock selection method is followed.

Benchmarks are pre-determined for each fund based on the most appropriate indices available in the market or by constructing proxy benchmarks out of multiple indices. Performance of each fund is continuously tracked based on the benchmarks and recalibrated.

A statistical analysis is carried out to determine that the **risk levels** are in tune with the risk appetite of the particular fund. Statistical tools such as the standard deviation and risk-adjusted return measures such as the Sharp ratio are calculated in order to compare the returns generated per unit of risk vis-à-vis benchmarks.

The investment policy has been designed by the **Board** to cover regulatory guidelines, the various product investment objectives, risk appetite strategic asset allocation and the investment style. It is ensured that the portfolio is always kept compliant with the relevant regulations. Our rigorous processes and risk/compliance controls are well documented.

the analyst expressions

► Gross Fund Return

Gross return for a fund is defined as the return calculated on an NAV basis plus the fund management fees which are debited periodically to the fund. We calculate gross fund returns in order to give uniformity while evaluating fund management performance as the fund management fees vary from company to company. Fund management charges are a matter of policy decision by the top management of a life insurance company. Hence, even if two funds from two different fund management companies give the same returns, the returns may not reflect that if they are calculated on an NAV basis.

We shall highlight this with the help of an example.

Reliance Life Insurance

Balanced Fund
NAV based Return=11.50 %
Fund Management Fee=2%
Gross Fund Return=13.50%

XYZ Insurance Company

Balanced Fund
NAV based Return=10.50%
Fund Management Fee=3%
Gross Fund Return=13.50%.

As seen above, though the gross return of both the companies were same, Reliance Life Insurance showed a higher NAV based return as the fund management fees were lower. Please note that the returns as given in The Analyst for all funds are computed on a gross basis.

► Benchmark Return

A benchmark is a standard against which the performance of an investment can be measured. Benchmarks are pre-determined primarily on the basis of the asset allocation structure of the fund.

Benchmarks can be readily available in the market or have to be constructed. The CNX Nifty is a readily available benchmark for our equity portfolio manager as the equity fund primarily invests in equities.

However, the benchmark for the Growth Fund of Reliance Life Insurance has been constructed as 60% of CRISIL Short Term Bond Index and 40% of CNX Nifty as the asset allocation of the growth fund is 60% of debt and 40% of equity. (Please refer to the Growth Fund page of The Analyst).

► Fund Standard Deviation

Risk of investing in a fund is identified by the volatility of the fund's periodic returns. Standard deviation measures the volatility of the fund's returns for a given time period.

In other words, Fund Standard Deviation for a particular time period gives us the deviation from the mean returns, that has occurred for that fund during that time period. For e.g. let us assume that the Balanced Fund has generated an average (mean) return of 11.55% for the last 2 years and that the corresponding standard deviation was 4.44%. That means that during the last 2 year time period, the balanced fund return varied between 15.99% (i.e. $11.55 + 4.44$) and 7.11% (i.e. $11.55 - 4.44$) during 65% of the time.

Higher the standard deviation, the greater the volatility, and therefore, the greater the risk of investing in that fund.

Thus, an investor has more information available at his disposal to evaluate the quality of performance of the fund and how volatile its returns are.

To carry it a step further, it is highly unlikely that a fund's return in any one year will be exactly the average. Rather, it will always be either higher or lower than the average. Thus, standard deviation teaches us to look beyond the "average annual return" figures that are touted by investment advisors.

► Fund Sharpe Ratio

Sharpe ratio of a fund tells us how much return the fund has been able to generate per unit of risk. The higher the Sharpe Ratio, the better the performance of a fund from a risk point of view.

The excess return generated by a fund for a particular time period is first calculated by subtracting the risk free rate from the rate of return generated by that fund during that time period. Dividing this result by the standard deviation of the fund return during that time period, one can obtain the Sharpe ratio.

Sharpe Ratio = Excess return / Annualized standard deviation of fund return

The "risk-free return" is the annualized return currently available on "risk-free" investments. This is usually assumed to be the return on a short government security like Treasury bill. A government security is sovereign credit which is the nearest to a risk free asset that one can get. For our calculations of the Sharpe ratios for all funds as given in the Analyst, we have assumed this risk free rate of interest to be at 5%.

We shall assume that 9.85% was the annualized gross return for a 3-year time period for the balanced fund, 5% p.a. was the assumed risk free rate of return as discussed above and 4.14% p.a. was the standard deviation of this 3-year return. The Sharpe ratio can be calculated as follows:

$$(9.85-5)\%/4.14\%=1.17.$$

The Sharpe ratio tells us whether the returns of a portfolio are due to smart investment decisions or a result of excess risk. This measurement is very useful because although one portfolio or fund can reap higher returns than its peers, it is only a good investment if those higher returns do not come with too much additional risk. The greater a portfolio's Sharpe ratio, the better its risk-adjusted performance has been.

▶ Benchmark Sharpe Ratio

Just as the fund returns are compared to a benchmark return, the Sharpe ratio of the fund is also compared to the benchmark's Sharpe ratio in order to evaluate the risk-adjusted performance. In our example above, let us assume that the benchmark Sharpe ratio of the balanced fund for the last 3 years is 0.98. This means that over a three-year time period, the Balanced Fund of Reliance Life Insurance has given a higher risk-adjusted return than the comparable risk-adjusted return provided by the constructed benchmark.

While calculating the benchmark Sharpe ratio of 0.98, let us assume that 9.10% was the annualized gross return provided by the constructed benchmark for the balanced fund for the last 3-year time period, 5% p.a. was the assumed risk free rate of return, and 4.21% p.a. was the standard deviation of the 3-year benchmark return.

The benchmark Sharpe ratio for the Balanced Fund for the last three years has been calculated as follows:
 $(9.10-5)\%/4.21\%=0.98.$

▶ Modified Duration of Debt Portfolio

The value of a fund's debt portfolio is sensitive to changes in interest rates. When interest rates rise, bond prices fall, and vice versa. Generally, a debt portfolio comprising of bonds with higher maturities will have a higher price fluctuation than a portfolio comprising of bonds with lower maturities. Modified duration, indicates the sensitivity of the value of the debt portfolio to any given change in interest rates. Modified Duration is derived from Duration, which represents a weighted average of the time periods to maturity.

Modified Duration gives one an immediate rule of thumb -- the percentage change in the price of a bond is the duration multiplied by the change in interest rates. So, if a bond has duration of 10 years and interest rates fall from 8% to 7.5% (a drop of 0.50 percentage points), the bond's price will rise by approximately 5% (i.e. $10 \times 0.50\%$).

Let us assume that the modified duration for the Balanced Fund is 2.03. If interest rates drop from 8% to 7.5%, the value of this debt portfolio will rise by 1.015% (i.e. $2.03 \times 0.50\%$). Similarly, when interest rates rise from 8% to 8.5%, say, the value of this debt portfolio will fall by 1.015%.

▶ Fund Beta

Beta measures the risk of a security (say a particular stock) in relation to its broad market. The broad market is generally defined as the specified benchmark index. The Beta assigned to the benchmark index is 1. Beta of the stock describes the sensitivity of the price of the stock to the benchmark index. (For the more statistically inclined readers, Beta is the slope of the regression line). It is generally calculated for equity portfolio/funds.

If a stock has a beta of 1, that stock is likely to generate the same returns as the market. If the beta of a stock is more than 1, it means that the stock is likely to give higher returns compared to the market but also at a higher risk as compared to the market. For instance, a stock with beta of 1.2 means that when the market, say Nifty, gives a return of 10%, that stock is likely to generate returns of 12% (i.e. $1.2 \times 10\%$). Similarly, a low beta stock has given lower returns compared to what the market has delivered for a particular time period. For e.g. for a stock with beta of 0.80, if the Nifty gives returns of 10%, the stock is likely to give returns of only half of that, i.e. 8%. (i.e. $0.80 \times 10\%$)

Now we shall see the impact of these two stocks when the market falls. When the Nifty gives negative returns of 10%, i.e. the market falls by 10%, the price of the stock with beta of 1.2 will fall by 12%. However, though the price of the stock with the low beta of 0.8 will also fall when the market falls, it will not fall as much as the market. If the market falls by 10%, the price of this scrip will fall only by 8%.

The fund beta is nothing but the betas of individual stocks in the equity portfolio multiplied by the weight of that stock in the portfolio. If a fund has a high beta, the equity portfolio of that fund is aggressive and tilted towards high beta stocks and vice versa. Please note that the betas of individual stocks as given in the Equity Fund page of the Analyst have been calculated based on the available prices of the stocks on the NSE for the last 1-yr period.
